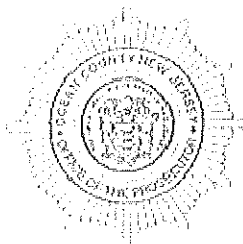

INVESTIGATION:

On Thursday, July 5, 2018, at approximately 2220 hours, the Jackson Township Police responded to the area of South New Prospect Road and Oak Drive for report of a motor vehicle accident involving a motorcycle resulting in a fatality.

This writer was notified by the Ocean County Communications Department of the crash and advised to contact Sgt. G. Vadalis of the Jackson Police Department Traffic Safety Unit. Once on scene, I was briefed of the known case details by Jackson Police Traffic Safety Officer E. Travisano.

A 2004 Red Yamaha 999 Model, driven by Anthony Griffin of Jackson, was traveling southbound on South New Prospect Road when Officer Daniels #288 of the Jackson Police Department observed Griffin fail to stop at a red traffic signal at the intersection of South New Prospect Road and Brewers Bridge Road. Officer Daniels attempted to make a motor vehicle stop which Griffin then attempted to elude Officer Daniels. As Griffin approached Oak Drive, a 2008 Hyundai Elantra, driven by Eric Larson of Jackson, was attempting a left turn from Oak Drive onto South New Prospect Road heading north. Griffin impacted Larson's vehicle on the driver side where both vehicles came to an uncontrolled final rest.


As a result of the crash, Anthony Griffin was pronounced deceased on scene at 2250 hours by Dr. Bains of Newark Beth Israel. Eric Larson was transported to Jersey Shore University Medical Center (J.S.U.M.C.) where he was listed in critical condition due to internal injuries. On July 27, 2018, while at J.S.U.M.C., Larson succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead at 1537 hours by medical staff due to complications sustained from the crash.

Due to the circumstances surrounding the crash investigation, Jackson Police were removed from the remainder of the investigation. This writer requested assistance from the Fatal Accident Support Team (F.A.S.T.); however, due to the July 4th holiday, no Officers were available to respond. At this writer's request, Jackson Police Traffic Safety Officer E. Travisano marked out the scene with spray paint for purposes of preserving the crash scene until the scene could be diagramed at a later date. Several days later, Lakewood Police Traffic Safety Officer and FAST member David Silberstein responded to the crash scene to take measurements utilizing his laser (for scale diagram, see attached).

MOBILE VIDEO RECORDER (M.V.R.): JACKSON MARKED PATROL UNIT #307:

This writer contacted Detective Brubaker from the Ocean County Prosecutor's Office Hi-Tech Unit to respond to the Jackson Police Department to extract the MVR video from Officer Daniels marked patrol Unit #307 (for extraction report, see Detective Brubaker's report). While at Jackson Police Headquarters, this writer along with Detective Carrington viewed the M.V.R. footage.

The footage shows a motorcycle, later identified as a 2004 Red Yamaha 999 Model, operated by Anthony Griffin, traveling eastbound on Brewers Bridge Road. Griffin had a red traffic signal in

his direction of travel and failed to come to a complete stop before making a right hand turn onto South New Prospect Road. The MVR captured the violation. Ptl. Daniels then initiates his overhead lights to attempt a motor vehicle stop at 22:22:18 traveling at 68 mph, as seen on the MVR. Griffin is then seen looking over his left shoulder, observing the overhead emergency lights then decides to accelerate at a high rate of speed in an attempt to elude Officer Daniels. As Griffin approaches Oak Drive, a gray 2008 Hyundai Elantra, driven by Eric Larson of Jackson, was attempting a left turn onto South New Prospect Road heading north. Griffin then collides into the driver side door of the Hyundai at 22:22:30. The pursuit lasted approximately 12 seconds. The area of impact occurs near the centerline of the roadway. Officer Daniels is seen arriving on scene and exiting his vehicle to assess the situation.

Had Griffin been traveling at the speed limit and in his lane of travel, Larson would have had enough time to visually observe Griffin approaching and the collision most likely would not have occurred. There were no witnesses to the crash except the Mobile Video Recorder (M.V.R.) from Officer Daniels marked patrol unit (for M.V.R. video, see CD).

NEXT OF KIN NOTIFICATION:

Jackson Police responded to 306 Brewers Bridge Road and made notification to Arlene Griffin, Anthony Griffin's mother of his death.

OCEAN COUNTY SHERIFF'S DEPARTMENT:

Detective J. Chester from the Ocean County Sheriff's Office responded to photograph and process the crash scene (for scene details, see Detective Chester's report).

AUTOPSY OF ANTHONY GRIFFIN: COMMUNITY MEDICAL CENTER:

A toxicology report authored by NMS labs showed that Mr. Griffin had positive levels of Marijuana found in his blood (for details, see NMS report).

DEATH OF ERIC LARSON: J.S.U.M.C.:

On July 27, 2018, at approximately 1536 hours, while at J.S.U.M.C., Larson succumbed to his injuries and was pronounced dead.

Due to the injuries sustained from the crash and Larson's health complications while at J.S.U.M.C., a statement was not taken by this writer from Larson as to what he observed prior to the crash.

CONCLUSION:

Upon completion of this investigation, it was determined that Anthony Griffin was at fault for the collision due to his attempt to elude police, specifically by exceeding the posted speed limit and operating his motorcycle recklessly at an high rate of speed causing a collision with a Hyundai Elantra, resulting in the death of Eric Larson and himself. Had Griffin been traveling at the posted speed limit, the vehicle making the left turn would have had a reasonable amount of time to make the turn safely and clear oncoming traffic.

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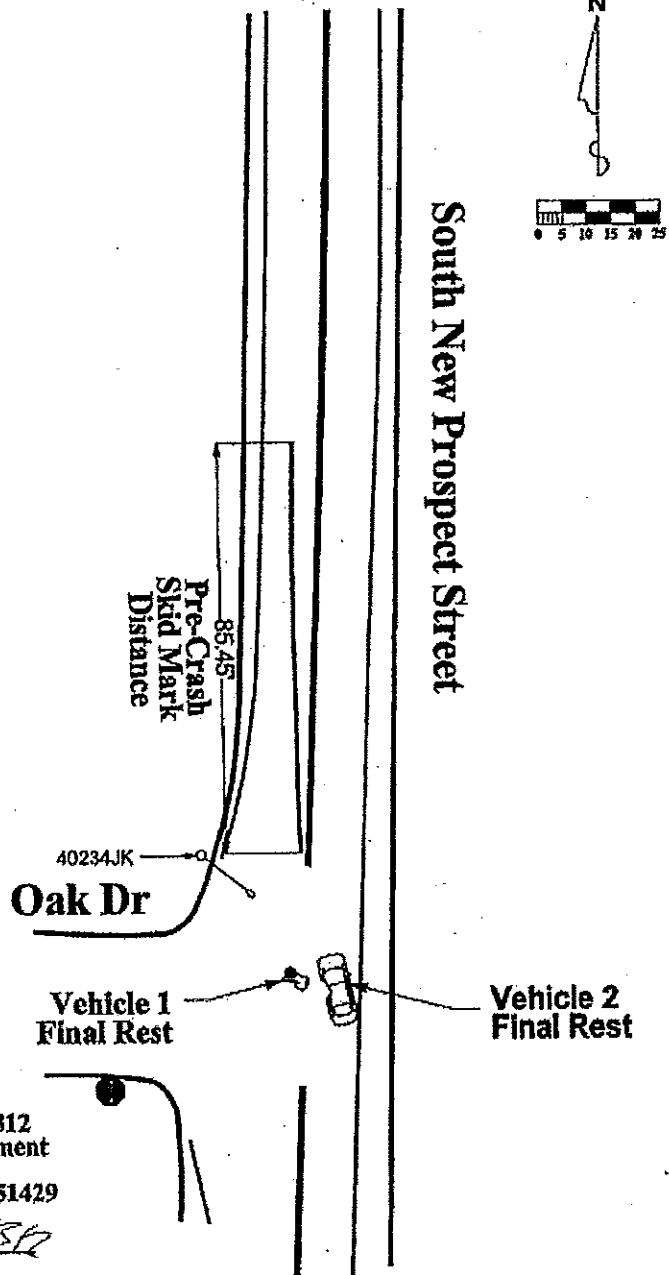

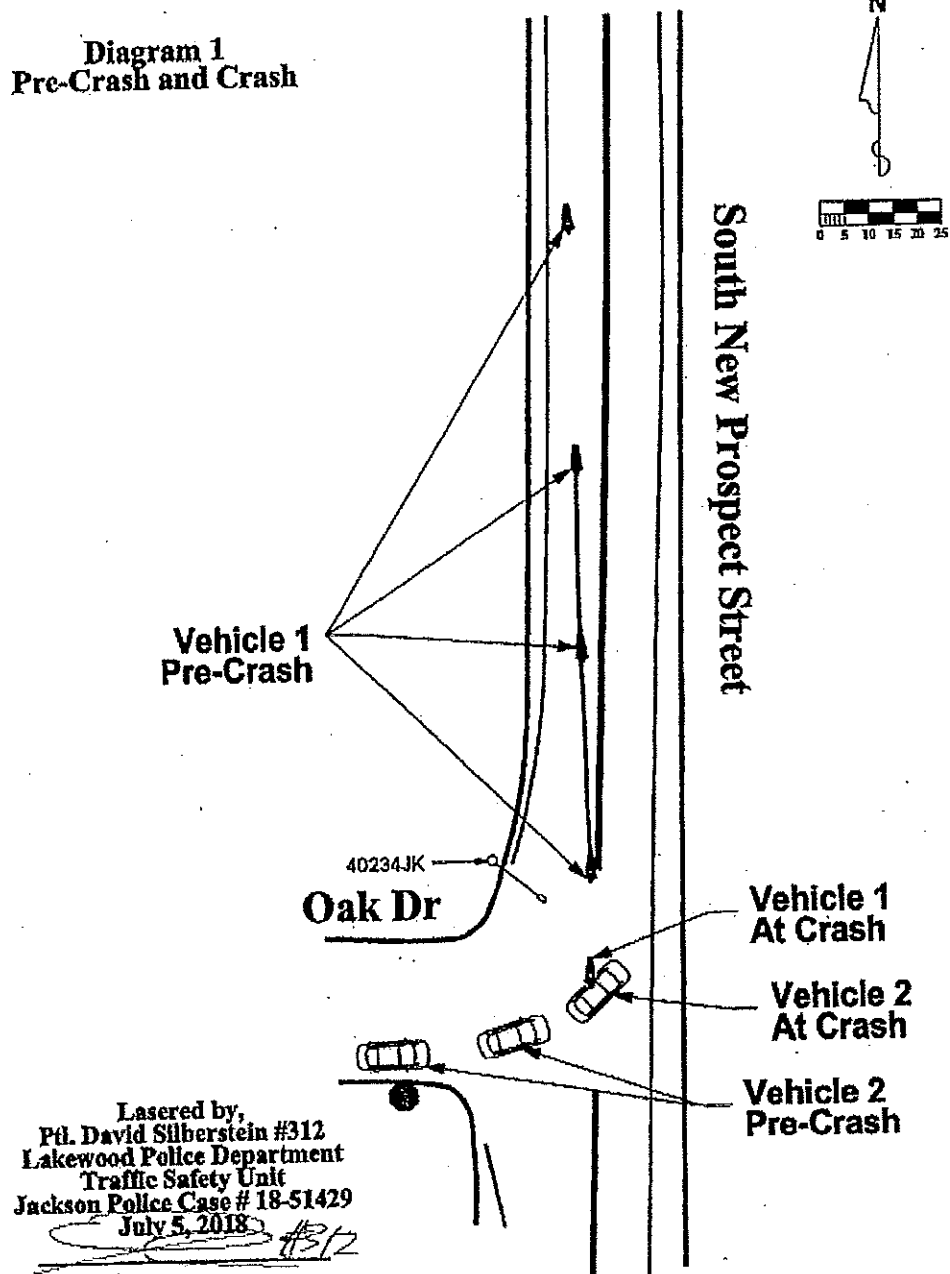

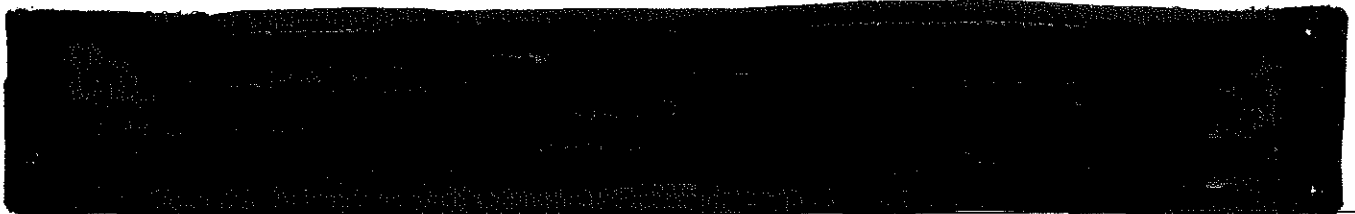

On July 5, 2018 at 22:20 hours I Police Officer Cherrick Daniels #288 was on patrol in the area of South New Prospect Road in marked patrol vehicle 307. While approaching the intersections of South New Prospect Road and Brewers Bridge Road, I observed a motor cycle traveling on Brewers Bridge Road fail to stop at a red stop signal before turning right onto South New Prospect Road. After the operator made the right onto South New Prospect Road, I visually estimated the motor cycle was traveling above the posted 45 MPH speed limit.

I continued on South New Prospect Road and accelerated towards the motorcycle to close the gap separating our two vehicles in order to conduct a motor vehicle stop. Due to the distance and speed which the motor cycle was traveling, I was unable to determine the characters on the vehicle's license plate, nor identify who was operating the vehicle.

When I closed the distance between our vehicles, I activated my overhead emergency lights in an attempt to stop the vehicle on the straight portion of the roadway near the Prospect Point apartment complex. Upon noticing my overhead emergency lights, the operator of the motorcycle turned and looked at me, before accelerating away at a higher rate of speed towards West County Line Road.

I continued to follow the motorcycle on South New Prospect Road towards West County Line Road, when I observed it collide with the driver side door of a silver vehicle which was making a left turn onto South New Prospect Road from Oak Drive.

At this time I contacted police dispatch and advised about the crash and requested additional units to the scene. I approached the crash to check on the welfare of those involved and was shortly assisted by police and first aid personnel.
