Mr. Bayer,
Thank you for your patience and I apologize for the delay in responding while I looked into this further.

The Mayor's office has reached out to the Edwin Forsythe Refuge, which is part of the National Wildlife Refuge System, managed by the US Dept. of Fish and Wildlife. The Township was informed that the National Wildlife Refuge System does not purchase developed properties, which is what they consider the parcel at 385 Adamston Rd to be. It is possible that if the owner of the property acquired a subdivision, separating the the building from the land where they proposed to build the grow house, the National Wildlife Refuge System might be interested in purchasing the unimproved portion of the land. That is something they would have to take up with the Department of Fish and Wildlife.

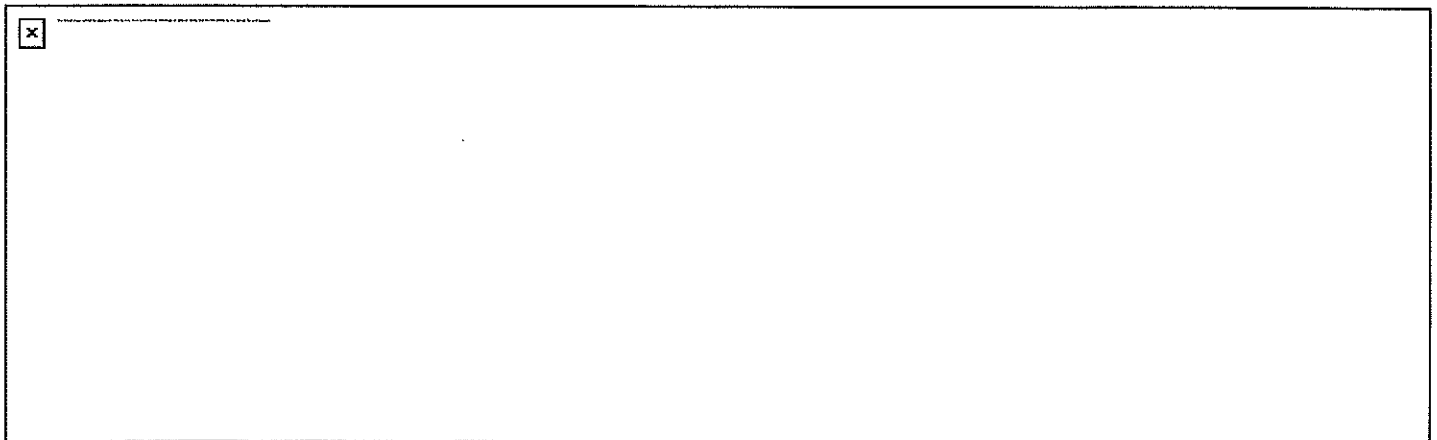
